**Neighboring Volunteers walked alongside families facing homelessness**

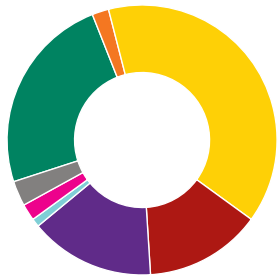
29% increase over last year
